On May 22 Constantine the Great died, leaving behind an invigorated, unified empire with Christianity as the state religion. This religion had become an integral part of Rome, and remains so to this day—a witness to the thoroughness of his work.

One such reform was a reorganization of the army, which helped Constantine when he faced tribes such as the Visigoths and the Sarmatians. Constantine was in Helenopolis, planning a campaign against Persia, when he fell ill. He set out to return to Constantinople, but grew worse and was forced to halt his journey.
