The draugr or draug is an undead creature from Norse mythology, also called aptrganga or aptrgangr, literally "again-walker". The word draugr can be traced to a Proto-Indo European stem \*d<sup>h</sup>rowg<sup>h</sup>os "phantom", from \*d<sup>h</sup>rewg<sup>h</sup>- "deceive". The Old Norse meaning of the word is a revenant. In Swedish, draug is a modern loan word from West Norse, as the native Swedish form drög has acquired the meaning of "a pale, ineffectual, and slow-minded person that drags himself along". Part IV: Draugr Attacks and Slaying the Undead The dead body was a vehicle of plague and illness, such as that of the sorcerer Mithothyn of Saxo Grammaticus, but in a day and age in which germ theory was unknown, the causative agent was perceived to be the evil intent of the draugr. Thus it followed that the dead might also make physical attacks against the living.

According to the legends and sagas, Draugr were the ghoul of dead people - they looked like what we now know under the name of zombies or decaying corpses. They were like warriors from old times, armed with old weapons, and worn robes.

The draugr is the name for an Icelandic zombie. According to Ármann Jakobsson, draugar (the plural of draugr) are neither alive nor dead. They are created not by witchcraft or sorcery, but from their own selfishness during their lives. By refusing to give up their wealth and property when they die, draugar are cursed to...
