Essentially, it covers primarily the linen stitch, which is a form of needleweaving through the mesh.

There is a book on linen stitch by Filet by the Sea. It is called Filet Lace, An Introduction to the Linen Stitch by Marie-Jo Quinault. It has a series of exercises and very good pictures and diagrams. There is another book on Filet Lace by Pauline Knight, a Batsford publication. From time to time an affordable copy comes up.

This book contains historical background in text and a wide variety of photographs of historical filet lace. Most of the sample patterns are worked in darning or linen stitch. There are some diagrams and examples largely taken from a Victorian Filet Lace Bedspread.

FILET LACE is a very old technique. A hand embroidery is done with a long blunt needle of thread, on a delicate knotted net lace (la fishnet), using counted stitch patterns. With the many techniques of Filet Lace we make lovely projects: doilies, clothing, curtains, trims and so much more. We also have scaled 1:6 netting for Action Figures.

Filet lace is the general word used for all the different techniques of Embroidery on Knotted Net (or in French Broderie sur Filet Noué). It is a hand made needlework created by weaving or Embroidery using a long blunt needle and a thread on a ground of knotted net lace or Filet Work made of square or diagonal meshes of the same sizes or of different sizes.

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
