Hi, I'm Shannon, and I'm an alcoholic. That's how I started my last post . I hadn't shared that part of my story publicly before, and it felt more than a little vulnerable. But it also felt like one of my most honest and genuine pieces of writing.

But every time I say "Hi I'm Emerald and I'm an alcoholic", I'm reaffirming my reason for being there in the first place. But you do what you feel comfortable with -no one is gonna kick you out because you don't want to 'say it'.

He'd been attending meetings for a week now, hardly a habit, but he found he was looking forward to the one today. He'd told Emmett last night about his efforts toward sobriety and Michael had not been pounding on his door this morning demanding entrance and an explanation for the "crazy" idea that Brian was an alcoholic.

As someone who is an alcoholic and has been in AA, I can tell you that if you really do want to support your friend, you can ask her what kind of support is best for her. Ultimately, she's the only one responsible for her own sobriety and it's up to her to determine her comfort level around alcohol. It can be very hard at first.

An A.A. meeting usually begins with a recovering alcoholic telling his "drunkalog," the story of his drinking days and how he eventually hit bottom. This blog entry will not be my drunkalog. What's said in the room, stays in the room. You may be wondering, in fact, why I'm violating the A.A. policy of anonymity and outing myself.
