The Irish Red and White Setter has a life expectancy of 11 to 15 years. Temperament & Train-ability. The Irish Red and White Setter was on the fast track to extinction at one point and thanks to some sportsmen; they made a quick comeback. While the breed is still a bit rare, you will find that these dogs are fun-loving, energetic, and sporty.

The Irish Red and White Setter is a fairly even-tempered and friendly dog, making it a wonderful family pet, especially for active families that spend a great deal of time outdoors. This breed does not make a good watchdog, as it is too friendly and eager to please people to protect the family or your property.

Irish Red And White Setters generally gain: 2 Pounds per week until 26 weeks old. Hip dysplasia is a common problem with Irish Red And White Setters. Make sure your dog isn't overweight. A Irish Red And White Setter with healthy weight will not have any ribs visible.
