Second, on October 10, 2006, New Jersey also became the first state to require postpartum depression screening of women who had recently given birth. The New Jersey Postpartum Depression Act requires that health care professionals educate women and their families about postpartum depression, both before and after delivery.

New Jersey enacted a program to screen all new mothers for PPD, with a hotline to connect women who suspect they have PPD to a network of care. In 2007, inspired by Codey's story, Sen. Robert Menendez (D-N.J.) went to work to create a similar program on the federal level.
